

SERMON

Title: Resolving to Set Your Mind on Christ

Text: Colossians 2:20-3:4 Preacher: John Hood

1. Resolved: To remember I am united with Christ (2:20 and 3:1a)

2. Resolved: To refuse to submit to worldly principles (2:20-23)

The Elemental Spirits of the World:

- 2:4 Plausible arguments (persuasive but Christ-less reasoning)
- 2:8 Empty and deceitful philosophy according to human traditions
- 2:16-17 Jewish legalism using the Old Covenant Law of Moses
- 2:18 Asceticism (false humility), worship of angels, and personal visions from a sensuous mind;
- 2:20-22 Regulations according to human precepts and teachings (manmade rules that God's word does not command)
- 3. Resolved: To set my mind on Christ above (3:1-3)
- 4. Resolved: To be motivated by appearing with Him in glory (3:4)

SERMON DISCUSSION/APPLICATION QUESTIONS

1. What worldly principles are you most tempted to submit to and why? What scriptural teaching can you use to resist submitting to that spirit and instead live according to Christ?

2. Read Colossians 2:23. Why do you think self-made religion is so tempting? Looking back on your life, has there ever been a moment when you had customized Christianity to your own liking? If so, how did you realize this and turn from it?

3. Read Colossians 3:2-3. What does it mean to seek the Lord and set your mind on things above? Is your mind currently set on Christ or on the things of earth? How does setting your mind on the things of earth affect your walk with Christ?

4. Is Christ's return a source of motivation in your life? If so, what is it about appearing with Christ in glory that motivates you to continue to follow him through the hardest parts of life?
